In conjunction with the vision of the College and the mission of the Residence Life & Housing to foster positive and safe environments which will heighten student engagement at Randolph-Macon College, the Office of International Education presents the International House as a Living and Learning Community. The International House was created back in late 90's, became permanent in 2008, and has since grown. The International House is currently located at 312 N. Center Street (#68 on R-MC's campus Map).

Please be sure to carefully read the philosophy, requirements, and rules of the International House. Students who wish to apply to live in The International House for the 2012-2013 academic year, will need to meet the specified requirements, agree to actively participate in the program as outlined by the Office of International Education, and submit a typed application that will be reviewed by a recommendation committee.

The Philosophy of the International House

The philosophy of the International House is to create an environment in which residents can experience an intercultural living arrangement. The International House consists of students from a variety of nationalities and cultures - including U.S. Americans. The goal of the International House is to foster intercultural friendships and experiences and to initiate cross-cultural learning opportunities for residents as well as the R-MC community. House members are required to work with each other and the Office of International Education in planning, organizing and implementing activities throughout the year and thereby agree to make a commitment to the philosophy of the International House.

All applicants must agree that they will **actively** participate in the 'living & learning' process through (1) collaboratively planning and implementing house programs (at least 4 per semester) while following the requirements and rules stated by the Office of International Education and the Office of Residence Life & Housing; (2) holding peers accountable to agreed upon community standards/expectations, and (3) living in the International House community and taking advantage of its culturally diverse environment and community members.

Requirements

- Scholarship:** Students applying to participate in the International House for the 2012-2013 academic year must have at least a 2.25 cumulative GPA at the time of application. Applicants with GPA lower than 2.25 must submit a letter of support in order to be considered.
- Citizenship:** All student applicants must be in "good standing" on campus. A **student in good standing will not have been brought through the judicial system and found in violation of a major Code of Student Conduct violation for the year of application or will not have been found responsible for a violation of the Code of Academic Integrity**, nor is the applicant on **housing probation during the semester of application process**. Also, students who have been found **responsible for substantial damage** to their own residence hall room, and/or damage to College property over the previous years will not be considered in "good standing".
- Recommendations:** Each applicant must obtain one recommendation from a faculty or staff member. Use the provided recommendation sheet for this requirement. Your faculty/staff member should submit their completed recommendation to the Office of International Education.



4. **Participation:** All applicants must agree that they will **actively** participate in required programming as stated by the Office of Residence Life & Housing and the office of International Education. The International House requirements and rules include but are not limited to:

Section One: Special Interest House requirements and expectations stated by the Residence Life and Housing Office

- ◆ Completing and submitting a Program Proposal at least one week before a program for each house program. (can be submitted electronically or handwritten)
- ◆ Completing and submitting a Program Evaluation no later than one week after the program for each house program. (can be submitted electronically or handwritten)
- ◆ Submitting Monthly House Reports on the date specified on each report.
- ◆ Meeting monthly with Mentor RA.
- ◆ Fall Semester Programming
 - 1 Educational Program
 - 1 Community Service
 - 2 Choice of House
 - 2 programs must be Campus wide programs (one of which must be educational or community service)
- ◆ January Term Programming
 - 1 program of your choice
- ◆ Spring Semester Programming
 - 1 Educational Program
 - 1 Community Service
 - 2 Choice of House
 - 2 programs must be Campus wide programs (one of which must be educational or community service)

*These are minimum requirements you may have and are encouraged to host more programs

Section Two: International House Rules

- ◆ I will actively and positively represent the International House and the residents by:
 - becoming involved in any school sponsored language and/or cultural associations that pertain to the individual student.
 - participating in International events and preparations for the event.
 - attending Multicultural Group and International Interest Group events.
 - attending house meetings and mandatory meetings called by the Office of International Education
 - participating in community service activities
 - participating in assessment efforts such as a survey and interview.
- ◆ I will willingly work with other house members as well as the Office of International Education and the Office of Residence Life & Housing to solve any issues that arise in the house.
- ◆ I will be respectful of other house members and accept each other's differences.
- ◆ I will take equal responsibility for keeping the following common areas clean: kitchen, living room, backyard, hallway and restrooms. Chores will be assigned and rotated on a regular basis– and I will be responsible for completing those assigned to me. I acknowledge that multiple failures to complete chores will result in my dismissal from the house.
- ◆ I will not smoke indoors.
- ◆ I will honor quiet hours as posted and will also agree to 24-hour courtesy hours.
- ◆ I will not host any room parties (as defined by the college).

If selected to live in the International House students must sign an agreement that they will participate in the required program above. The International House helps provide an inviting learning community for students from a variety of nationalities and cultures - including U.S. Americans, and a safe atmosphere must be implemented following the College policies as stated in *Fishtales*. Failure to participate in the program as set by the Office of International Education and the Office of Residence Life & Housing may result either in being removed from the International House anytime throughout the year or in code of conduct sanctions.

Each International House applicant must agree to the following in order to be considered in the application/selection process and ultimately if selected to live in the International House for the 2012-2013 academic year.

**Signing does not guarantee an applicant a space in the International House living and learning environment.*

- Each community member must agree to live by the community standards set forth in the living and learning environment. Each community member must also respect the International House community and abide by community standards when visiting other residents in the International House and/or when utilizing common area space.
- Each community member must participate in the planning and implementation process for house programs, and any other program that is stated by the Office of International Education as a requirement to attend. House members who repeatedly fail to participate in House events and responsibilities will be asked to leave.
- In the event that a community member is found in violation of the International House living and learning standards, the Office of International Education (in conjunction with the Office of Residence Life & Housing) will work with the student in violation regarding sanctions through the Code of Student Conduct, Residence Hall policies and International House community agreements. Students who are found in violation are at risk for being removed from the International House community and be relocated to a residence hall on campus.
