

Estimated Cost

\$3,700

The estimated cost per student is all-inclusive EXCEPT there will be up to 2 site visit days where students will be responsible for their own Lunch and/or dinner. While in London for our "middle weekend" students will be responsible for their own lunches and dinners (Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday). The hotel in London is covered in the all-inclusive, as is breakfast at the hotel. Students may have sight-seeing costs while in London.



Important Note:

Students must make the deadlines for deposits and full payment as instructed below. **October 1st** is the last day to ADD or DROP J-term study/travel courses. Date	Amount Due
At time of registration	\$100 non-refundable deposit (students must take their check and signed add-form to Registrar's Office to be added to the course. \$100 is applied to the 50% deposit due by Aug. 1st - transferrable if student changes to another study/travel course before Oct. 1st**)
Prior to Aug. 1	50% deposit (payable by check, due to Business Office. Non-refundable after October 1st**)
Aug. 1 - Sept. 30	\$100 deposit at time of registration plus 50% of program fee due immediately, if student is adding a J-term study/travel course during this period
By Oct. 1	100% students' J-term study/travel program fee due in full. Students who have not paid in full by October 1st will be withdrawn from the J-term study/travel course. Course Instructor will determine amount of refund available to withdrawn students**

Description

Wroxton College serves as our home while in England. Students can take two of the three courses offered



CSCI 106: In this course students will develop problem solving skills using computer applications found in a business environment.

BUSN 481: This course looks at the development and consequences of the Industrial revolution in Great Britain from economic, sociocultural and technological perspectives.

ECON 383: International trade theory and finance with particular emphasis on the development of the European Union.

As part of our experience we will visit points of interest including Stonehenge, the Roman baths of Bath, Stratford-upon-Avon, Oxford, and Warwick Castle.

We'll spend a long weekend in London, combining coursework with sight-seeing and some relaxation. Also scheduled are industry site visits, connecting theory to practice.
