The PCAT (Pharmacy College Admission Test) is a specialized test that helps identify qualified applicants to pharmacy colleges. It measures general academic ability and scientific knowledge necessary for the commencement of pharmaceutical education.

PCAT Sections and Times			
Writing	Propose a solution to a problem in an original essay	1 prompt	30 min.
Biological Processes	General Biology, Microbiology, Human Anatomy & Physiology	48 items	40 min.
Chemical Processes	General Chemistry, Organic Chemistry, Basic Biochemistry Processes	48 items	40 min.
Critical Reading	Comprehension, Analysis, and Evaluation	48 items	50 min.
Quantitative Reasoning	Basic Math, Algebra, Probability & Statistics, Precalculus, and Calculus	48 items	45 min.

Score Range and Averages

PCAT: scored between 200-600

Average Score: around 430

Writing Sample is scored **between 1-6** by two scorers, and the two scores given are **averaged**.

Retakes

After sitting for the PCAT five times, restrictions may be placed on any subsequent registration.
